Additional staff housing is needed to carry Camrec into the future.

We have not settled on a final design, but current thoughts include multiple living spaces so that we can have room for year round staff as well as have a separate smaller apartment for long term volunteers.

At Camrec we are in a landscape of ongoing change and development! We hope to continue growing programs and facilities that can meet the needs of the church and communities engaged and connected here. We see the experience of camp as an opportunity to invest in the future of Anabaptism, as well as the Kingdom of God, through children and adults!

Included is one rendering of what the house and additional dwelling unit might look like set into the hillside here at camp! If you are interested in helping us reach our goal of \$250,000.00 checks can be made out to Camp Camrec with "staff housing" in the memo line. Donations are tax-deductible.
